

I Am a Lutheran



Easter morning, the congregation gathers.

Something looks different. Are there flowers? Are the paraments white? Are there butterflies or banners or something else that sets this season apart?

How does the sanctuary change from the somber, starkness of Good Friday to the beauty of Easter morning?

I am a Lutheran who comes to the building when no one else is there. Maybe I posed for the photo. Probably I did not. But I was there, in the quiet moments between worship services. Finding linen wrappings. Placing flowers. Returning with newly made butterflies.

Something sounds different. Alleluias have returned to our lips. Musicians have been rehearsing to share the joy of this season. Christ is Risen!

How do the radio and livestream connect us so we can hear and see and participate together in worship across time and distance?

Something tastes of the meal God has prepared for us in the bread and wine of Communion. When did the glasses get filled and the bread prepared? We taste and see that the Lord is good.

For all the unseen Lutherans who prepare the sanctuary for worship not only for Easter morning but also for all the other seasons of the year, we give thanks.

Joint Theological Day

On Thursday, April 18th a van load of leaders headed to Concordia College in Moorhead for our annual Joint Theological Day. Leaders from both the Eastern North Dakota and Northwest Minnesota Synods gather each year in the spring for a day of learning. It's also an excellent opportunity to connect with colleagues and Synod staff. From the Christians in Action Ministry Pr. Stephanie Gossett, Shar Gumke, Pr. Susan Haukaas, Deacon Tara Longden, Pr. Linda Schauer, Vicar Andrew Stephans, Pr. Erik Weber, Pr. Kristi Weber, and Joel Zenker were all in attendance.

This year's our focus was on wellness. Our Keynote Speaker, The Rev. Dr. Tory Troftgruben teaches New Testament and Wartburg Theological Seminary in Iowa. He spoke about how important it is for those in leadership to take good care of themselves. This is an important model for the congregation, but also vital to doing ministry well. Using the ELCA's excellent resource, The Wholeness Wheel, Dr. Troftgruben invited those gathered to think about how we care for ourselves as an act of ministry.

Afternoon workshops dug deeper into several topics. "Keeping the Faith in Ministry" explored how important it is for leaders to have personal faith practices outside of their calling. "The How and Why Path to a Quality Sabbath" was a panel discussion about Sabbath taking and planning for a Sabbatical. "Embodying Spirituality" was a conversation about how our bodies are a big part of our spirituality and not (as they have often been categorized) an impediment. "Sabbath Resistance" explored the Old Testament theology of Sabbath.

Peace to You



John 20:19-23

"Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.

So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.""

Not always an easy peace; never an insignificant or halfhearted peace, but the peace of Christ be with you always!

Peace is something that is not always easy to find in this world. It is a stillness and a calm that comes over us like a light breeze. When we allow our lives to become complicated and overly busy, there is little time for peace. If we focus on what the world and the news networks tell us to, it is difficult to identify peace.

Yet peace is exactly what Jesus offers to us, his disciples. In John's Gospel, Jesus appears to his disciples in the upper room after his resurrection. He says, "Peace be with you. As the father sent me, now I send you." With those words, he breathed the Holy Spirit on them.

Christ's peace passes all understanding and is not out of our reach. To acknowledge and accept this peace from Jesus, we have to slow down. We have to take a deep breath, in and out, and be still for just a moment. Then we have to focus on the peace bringer, the peace giver, Jesus. Beloved, may the peace of Christ be with you always! Amen.

Jamestown Area Grief Support Team in Action

The Jamestown Area Grief Support Team is a group of volunteers gathered for the purpose of providing educational opportunities and support to those who are grieving, offering hope and healing. JAGST is committed to meeting the needs of the grieving through adult support groups and other events. This community group welcomes people of all faiths. The spring support group has already begun and gathers a group of about ten people for six meetings. Support groups are offered each spring and fall. The JAGST board (pictured) meets monthly to coordinate upcoming and ongoing events. There are community representatives along with caring professionals who volunteer to support those who are grieving. The members of JAGST are not professional counselors and do not offer individual counseling. They do, however, follow the "companioning" philosophy of grief support. There is a deep need for compassion and companionship for those who grieve because we are a grief avoidant society. Only a small number of those who could participate in the support groups do and a major challenge facing JAGST is to continue to invite and include people who don't know that this organization exists or are hesitant to check it out. Sometimes JAGST knows of community needs, such as offering some programs for adults who have lost adult children, and publicizes a new offering, only to have to cancel it because of low (or no) registrations. Events are offered each year for those who have lost a partner. An overnight widows retreat is held each fall, and a one day widowers retreat has been offered in mid-winter. JAGST has also offered a pregnancy and infant loss group, usually in October. JAGST support groups are free for participants. Our team worked in groups selling sno-cones, cotton candy and a few sold nachos. Did you know that pink cotton candy is more popular than blue cotton candy? Or that blue sno-cones are more popular than red ones? By the end of the evening, our crew was even mixing red and blue making purple sno-cones!

In addition to having fun, and bringing joy to children and adults attending the circus, each youth and adult volunteer earned \$30 toward future Christians in Action partnership events. This is one way to make big events such as the Synod Castaway Youth Retreat in September or the ELCA Youth Gathering to be held this summer in New Orleans to be even more affordable. In total, our group earned over \$500 in one evening.



- ^ Christians in Action reimbursements include funds for shared staffing (Pastoral Intern, and Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministries), administration (Google workspace account and telephones), and events for multiple congregations.
- **Some funds received in previous years are designated for expenses. Thank you for your generosity throughout the year that helps strengthen Trinity's mission and ministry.

During the first quarter of 2024, Trinity has been adjusting to the changes of no longer having an active Capital Campaign. Giving to the RENEW Campaign in 2021, 2022, and 2023 not only helped Trinity replace the roof, steps, and boiler, but also supported facilities operations. In 2024, all facilities operations expenses, mortgage payments, and savings for the cooling system are now part of the General Fund.

Trinity's livestreaming, music, and education ministries are greatly appreciated by the congregation and community. Thank you for your generosity that helps fully support not only these but also the other ministries and mission of Trinity Lutheran Church.


